

## BFSNA General Meeting Minutes, June 9, 2009

Andrew Parthum opened the meeting at 7:10 p.m. followed by introductions.

### Speaker:

Jeff Drago from the City of Boston Rental Housing Resource Center reported on the services available from his department. The Center provides mediation services to resolve issues of dispute without going to court. It is a resource available for both landlords and tenants. There are attorneys on staff who are experts in rental issues. Mr. Drago gave out a handbook covering Boston's regulations related to renting and a handout titled "What Every Tenant Should Know." Items such as fees, code violations, noise, evictions, and many others are covered in these documents. (Most people there were not aware that landlords are required to put security deposits in an interest-bearing account and pay the tenant the interest yearly.) Mr Drako left extras of these for any members who are interested but were not present at the meeting. Those present discussed joining with another neighborhood association to have a meeting to attempt to attract more tenants and landlords to inform everyone of his/her legal obligations and rights concerning renting.

### Reports:

The zoning issues that we supported at the last meeting all passed.
