7:05 p.m. Project Place's "Climb for a Cause" (Christina Miron). Project Place is a South End-based organization that seeks to provide people with the skills, education, and resources they need to break the cycle of homelessness and poverty. Their approach involves making a two-year commitment to each client, providing them with life and work skills training, transitional employment, career counseling, access to technology, and individualized guidance. 7:15 p.m. Proposed recreational marijuana dispensary at 1679 Washington Street (Ben Virga/Frozen 4 and team). Frozen 4 Corp is seeking a license from the Boston Cannabis Board to open an adult-use (recreational) marijuana store at 1679 Washington Street (corner of Worcester Street), in the ground-floor commercial space formerly occupied by Andy's Cleaners. Frozen 4 currently operates a busy recreational dispensary in Marshfield and the team involved with this proposal also has licenses to cultivate and manufacture cannabis products at various locations in Massachusetts and is pursuing a Quincy-based cannabis delivery concept. The 1679 Washington Street property was recently acquired by the owner of Mike's City Diner, who would be the landlord for the proposed establishment. Frozen 4 co-founder Ben Virga and other members of the proponent team will make a presentation and take questions and comments.

Note that this is the first community meeting regarding this proposal; the first opportunity for the proponents and South End neighbors and residents to speak and hear from one another. We do not expect to adopt a BFSNA organizational position on this proposal at this meeting, but may do so at a future BFSNA meeting if member sentiment warrants. Also, as a separate matter, the existing medical marijuana dispensary at 591 Albany Street (run by Affinity) is applying to add adult-use sales at its location. We will hear from Affinity and its team about their application at a special BFSNA meeting later this month or early next, date TBD. (We'll circulate a separate agenda for that meeting, and a Zoom link, in the days ahead.)

As with all our meetings, all neighborhood residents and stakeholders are invited and welcome to attend and participate in the discussion.
